

## Shirt Dress & Brief Case



### Supplies

Sweet Pea Designer Series Paper Stack

Sweet Pea Stitched Felt

Chat Room Rub-Ons

Wide Oval Punch

Sponges

Taken with Teal Classic Ink

Scallop Trim Border Punch

Scallop Trim Corner Punch

Corner Rounder

1" Circle Punch

Card Stock; Whisper White

Flower Ribbon Slide

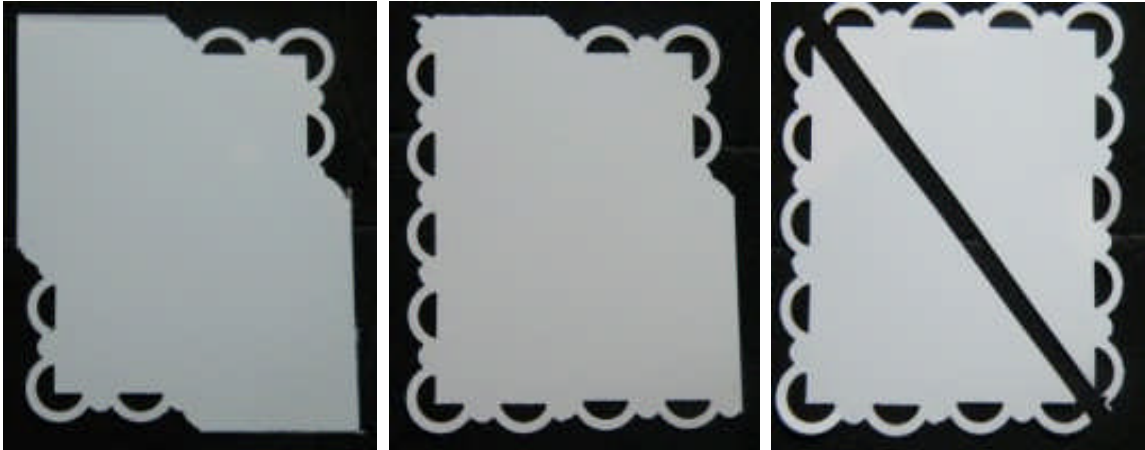
White Taffeta Ribbon

Sticky Strip

Self Adhesive Velcro

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1. Cut a piece of Whisper White card stock 2" x 2 ½". Punch two opposite corners with the Scallop Trim Corner Punch (*photo 1*) and use the Scallop Trim Border Punch to continue down the sides (*photo 2*). Do the same on the opposite side
2. Cut a straight line across the two unpunched corners as shown in photo 3.



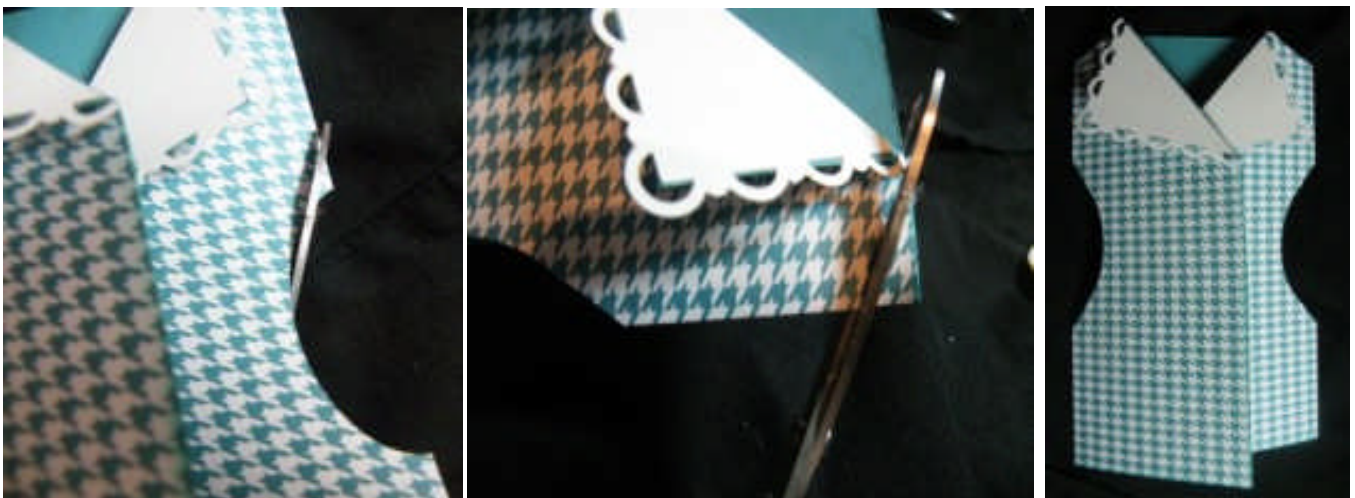
3. Cut a piece of DSP 6" x 8 ½". Score at 2 ½" and 6".
4. Glue the two scalloped pieces to the corner of the DSP leaving the scallops stick out past the edges a little.



5. Run the tip of your bonefolder along the edge of the white card stock to score the DSP. Fold the two corners back on the score line to form the dress collar.



6. Use the Wide Oval Punch to make a waist.



7. You can leave the shape as it is or trim off some excess. I trimmed a tiny piece from the waist to soften the curves and snipped a piece from the corner to shape the shoulders.

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8. Put a small piece of sticky strip (or a glue dot) at the waist line just left of the centre. Thread a 7" piece of White Taffeta Ribbon through a ribbon slide and stick it to the dress. It's easier to work with if only the ribbon is stuck down and not the ribbon slide.



9. Wrap the ribbon all the way around **the front left panel only** and pull the ribbon back through the slide.

10. Trim the end of your ribbon, leaving it long enough to hide the bare right side.



11. Punch a Wide Oval shape, add a Rub-On sentiment and a Sweet Pea Stitches Felt flower to the inside of the card.



12. To help hold your card closed, put a dot of Tombow Multi Adhesive on the inside left panel of your card and let it dry so it becomes a temporary adhesive.

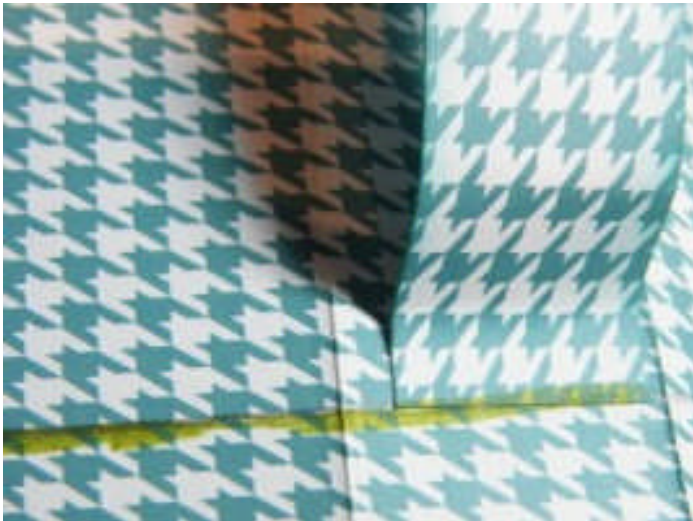


If you're hoarding your Sweet Pea Stitches Felt flowers, another alternative is to punch some shapes from your scraps to decorate the inside of your card.

## Brief Case



1. Cut 3 pieces of DSP; one 5" x 12" and two pieces 1/2" x 12"
2. Score all three pieces at 3 1/2", 5 1/2" 9" and 10"
3. Draw a pencil mark 1" in from each long side



4. Cut a pocket 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" a handle 3/4" x 3 1/2".
5. Glue the handle along the inside edge of the pencil mark. *(I marked it with old olive so it would show better in the photo) Note: your handle will not lay flat.*



6. Run a line of Glue or snail along the pencil marks and stick the two ½” strips to the base. Don’t forget to match up the scorelines.



7. To make a gift card pocket, score the 3 ½” x 3 ½” piece of card stock at ½” on 3 sides. Trim the corners and punch a half circle in the top.

8. Fold the 3 scored sides under and attach it right above the fold on the back panel. Decorate with a Sweet Pea Stitched Felt flower.



9. Cut a scrap of Whisper White card stock. This one is 1 ¾” x 4”. Add a rub-on sentiment and some Sweet Pea Stitched Felt circles.

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
