Moving Circle Card


Supplies

White scallop circle
White 3" circle
Strip of Black cardstock (approx 1/2" x 4")
Small and large oval punches.
Stamps and ink in at least 2 colors
Card base or top note cut from cardstock
1 brad
Anywhere hole punch (or push pin)






- 1. Punch a hole in the centre of your circle and scallop circle.
- 2. Cut a slit from the outer edge to the circle
- 3. Stamp on the half opposite the slit in two different colors as shown in the photos above.



4.Turn the 3" circle over and glue the ½" strip just below the slit as shown



5. Slide the two circles together as shown in the photos above



- 6. Poke a hole the centre of the circles and through the card base and attach with a brad.
- 7. Adjust your handle and slit to where you would like them to be then staple the scallop to the card base right over the slit. Make sure the staple is only on the outside of the small circle. This creates a stopper for your handle so your card won't come apart each time you turn it.



8. Cut and oval or other embellishment to hide your staple. The small circle needs to move freely into the slit so put glue only on the stapled area or on the bottom of the oval below the slit.

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
