

Origami Pennant Angel

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Supplies

Stampin' Up's Pennant Die

Stampin' Up's Beautiful Butterflies Die

Word Window Punch

1" Circle Punch

1-3/8" Circle Punch

Curly Label Punch

Scallop Oval Punch

Boho Blossoms Punch (large flower)

Designer Series Paper plus some cardstock scraps for head and arms

White Taffeta Ribbon

Sponge daubers and coordinating ink

Basic Black marker

Black Stazon Ink

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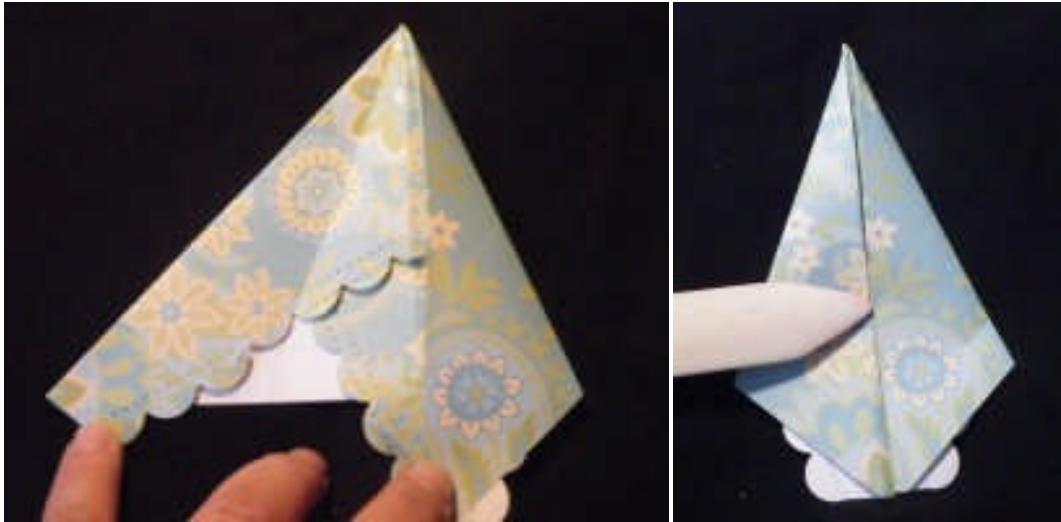
Cut a (large) pennant using the pennant die. Since a center fold isn't necessary flatten the fold out with your bone folder so it isn't as noticeable.



Fold the point down so 2 of the scallops extend past the bottom edge of the pennant.



Fold both sides down so they meet in the centre. Your centre fold will still be faintly visible to use as a guideline.



Fold both sides down again so they meet in the centre.



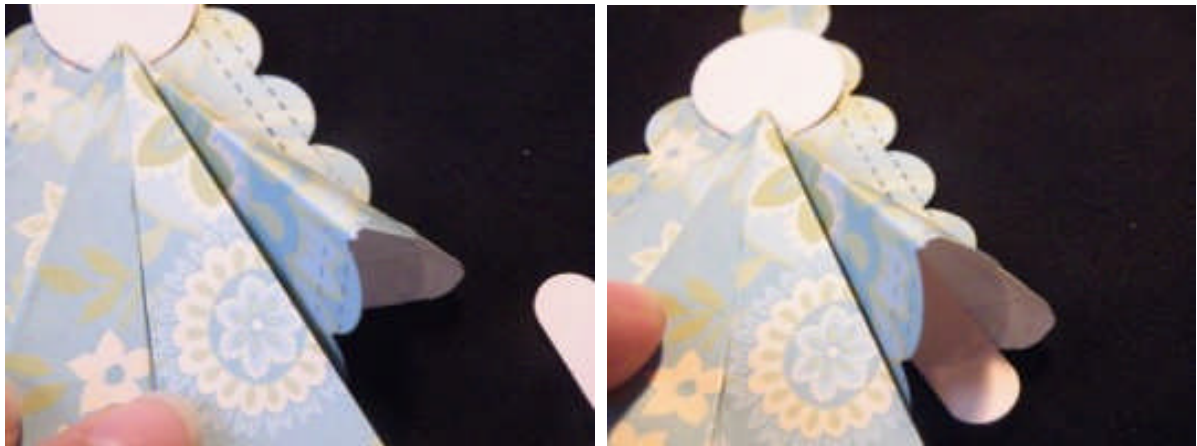
Unfold the pennant then fold the bottom up so 3 scallops are extended above the top fold as shown in the photo on the right.



Use your bonefolder to tuck in the sides of the dress leaving the sleeves out. The last photo shows what it should look like from the back

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You can make your sleeves 3D by inserting your bone folder and gently tugging. Don't worry, the sleeves will still flatten out if you plan to use your angel on a card and mail it. Punch two arms using the word window punch and insert them into the sleeves.



Here are the punched shapes you'll need plus a flower to add for the collar (*forgot that in the photo*). To make the halo punch the 1" circle first then the larger circle.

To make the face punch a 1" circle then take a little chunk out using the scallop oval to look like bangs.



Using a sponge dauber add some colour to the face. Use pink in the cheek area. Sponge the hairline with ink to match the cardstock you used for the hair. This helps to blend the face into the hair.

Draw the face on with black marker.



Attach the halo as shown in the first photo and assemble the pieces for the angels head. Bend the flower around the tip of the dress and tuck it under the angel's chin.



Stamp a sentiment on a strip of taffeta ribbon using black stazon ink. Tie two knots and tuck the ends under the angel's hands.
